Armies from both sides must travel vast forestlands between these locations. Where the Creek and Cherokee Nations once hunted deer and buffalo, Americans, on both sides, hunt each other. It is a treacherous time. A time for unlikely heroes.

We got 'em now!

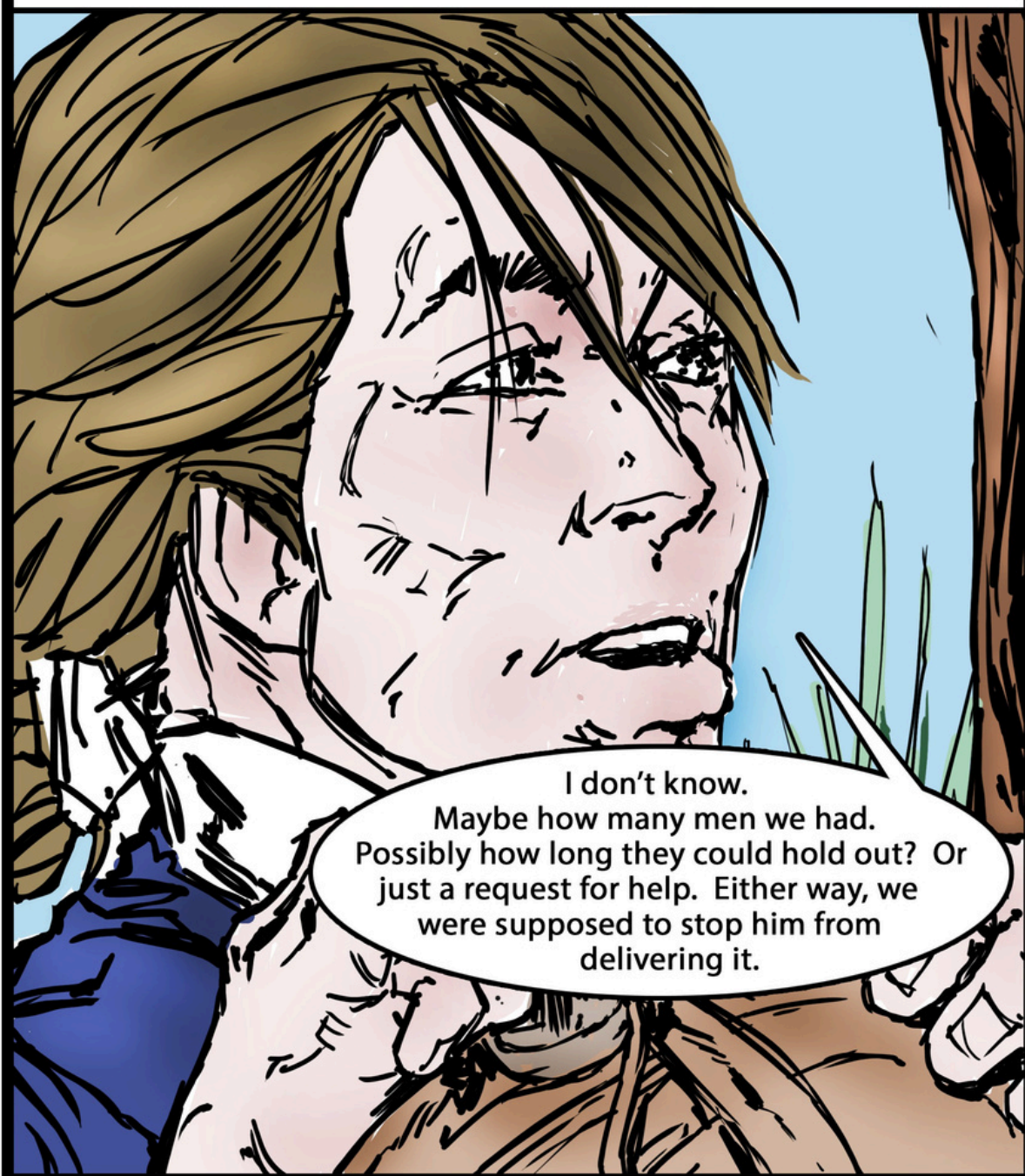
This way!
